SAMUEL MARKS AND KATIE KRANTZ OF EAST CHAPEL HILL NAMED RECIPIENTS OF COY MADDRY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Two outstanding student-athletes from East Chapel Hill High School have been named the recipients of the Coy Maddry Memorial Scholarship Award from Orange United Methodist Church.

Samuel Marks and Katherine Anne Krantz have been selected as the winners and were recognized at worship services at Orange on Sunday, June 6. Each student received a grant of one thousand dollars from the church.

The scholarship comes from the fund established by family and friends in memory of Avery Coy Maddry, a 1990 graduate of Chapel Hill High School and a freshman at North Carolina State University at the time of his death at the age of 18 on January 7, 1991. The fund is administered through Orange United Methodist Church, where Coy was an active member, and the award is in its 20th year.

Sam earned 12 varsity letters during his East career in cross-country, indoor and outdoor track and served as captain of all three squads. He was active in a number of clubs at East, including the Latin Club, and has been very active in his faith community, the Judea Reform Congregation, including serving as a Sunday school teaching assistant.

An outstanding student with a weighted GPA of almost 5.0, he will be attending Duke University in the fall.

Katie was a four-year starter at center mid on the strong East women's soccer teams, earning all-PAC VI Conference honors twice. She was involved in student government and was a member of both the National Honor Society and French Honor Society,

A member of St. Thomas More Church, she has gone on several week-long summer mission trips with YouthWorks. She will be attending the University of North Carolina in the fall.

The scholarship candidates must be varsity athletic letterwinners at a Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools high school who best exemplify Coy's life through qualities he demonstrated: hard work and dedication, strong academics, and exemplary character and leadership as reflected in church, school and civic activities. Coaches and teachers nominate candidates for the honor.
